_____ Bi 307 Minor Prophets

Set in the historical context of each book the major themes will be traced and exegetical problems discussed. Prophetic passages will be correlated with other Scriptures in an attempt to unify biblical prophesy into an understandable framework.

This is an intensive review of grammar and punctuation with special emphasis on the student's ability to put his knowledge into practice, especially with reference to the structure of the English language in its grammatical form.

_____ Mi 302 Cults

The origin, history, and teachings of the principle religions cults to be found in the United States today will be studied. This study will lead to a Biblical basis for the refutation of their claims and methods of presenting the Gospel to their adherents.

This is a basic course in Biblical education, which will provide a sound basis for an effective educational ministry.
